Help Us Wave Goodbye to Human Trafficking Save the Date: March 23, 2019 An educational luncheon overlooking the ocean at Kyle G's

The International Outreach Committee of the Woman's Club of Stuart needs your support to help prevent human trafficking that is happening in our backyard. Please join us on Saturday, March 23, 2019 from 11:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Kyle G's restaurant in Jensen Beach for a luncheon benefiting Catch the Wave of Hope, a local organization dedicated to abolishing human trafficking.

Many believe that sex trafficking happens overseas or in major metropolitan cities, but it is happening in our communities on the Treasure Coast. We can prevent these horrific crimes by learning to identity the signs and save children – possibly our own children and grandchildren from traffickers and predators. Knowledge is power: know what the signs are and say, "Not on my watch!"

Did you know?

- The average age that a girl is first sold/trafficked is 12 to 14 years old.
- On the average a trafficked girl or woman is sold over 20 times per day.
- Through awareness presentations Catch the Wave of Hope has helped close brothels in our backyard on the Treasure Coast.

Learn more and equip yourself with the tools to keep your family and our community safe. There will be two expert speakers featured during the event including a survivor of human trafficking and Dr. Mary L. Rosier, wife of the former Executive Director of Education for the Sate of Washington. Mary will share her story on how love blinds and the signs to identify suspicious behavior.

The cost of attendance will be \$60 per person and will include a three course luncheon with menu options, valet parking and a ticket raffle. As space is limited please be sure to reserve your seat soon. Advanced reservations are required.








The following book <u>After the Rain</u> about Women's Clubs is being recommended by our President, Janie Copes for you reading enjoyment.

It's 1888. Can Belle Carson reinvent her life by moving in next door to Thomas Edison's winter estate?

From *New York Times* bestselling author Jane Lorenzini comes a story of heartbreak and healing set against the backdrop of exotic Southwest Florida.

January 1888. The small town of Fort Myers is buzzing about a possible visit from famous winter residents Mina and Thomas Edison. When the local newspaper reports that the couple needs a gardener for their riverside estate, nearly everyone lines up to apply.

For twenty-five-year-old Belle Carson, a painful childhood secret has kept her world — and her hopes for the future — small. But with lush gardens already sprouting in her imagination, Belle decides to fight for the job and the opportunity to move from a cramped storage room to a charming cottage next door to the Edison homes and laboratory. Yet, when her dark past threatens to destroy everything she has so carefully cultivated, she must battle harder than ever for her best life — and the chance to live it.

Jane Lorenzini spent thirteen years as a television journalist in various cities, including Fort Myers, Florida. There she interviewed a horticulturist at the historic Thomas Edison winter estate, an expansive botanical wonderland. After leaving broadcasting, Jane co-wrote three non-fiction books (with her dear friend Hoda Kotb) about inspirational people and their journeys. Curious about whether she could create fiction, Jane recalled her passion for the historical treasure – now the Edison and Ford Winter Estates – and set her debut novel there.
